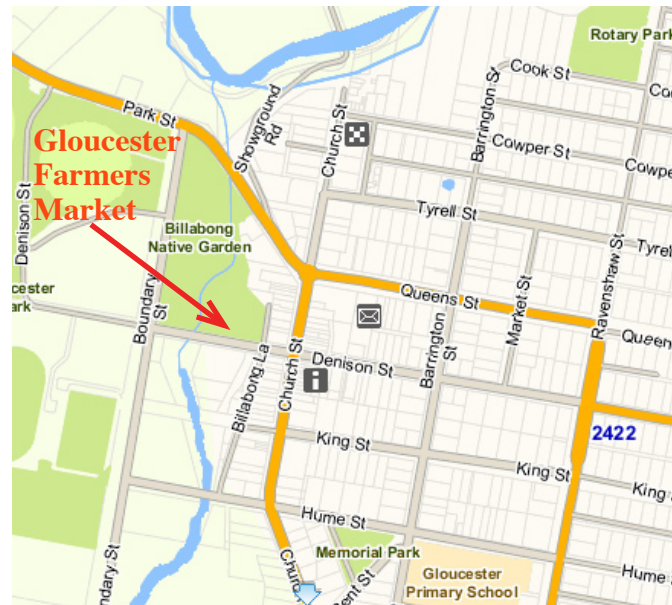

Gloucester Farmers Market is intended...

- as a outlet for homegrown and fresh regional produce
- to provide community members and visitors with fresh, seasonal fruits, vegetables, flowers and plants from farms and growers in the region
- to promote and provide an outlet for local produce and small and regional growers
- to reduce the cost and environmental impact of transportation
- to encourage organic production and a minimum use of chemicals
- to provide free advice to growers including how to adapt to our changing environment
- to provide free stall space for local not-for-profit and charity organisations wishing to offer food and beverages as a fundraiser
- to provide a fun, safe venue for families and to encourage local entertainers
- to encourage recycling and use of non-plastic packaging

Our History...

The Gloucester Region was originally developed in the early 1830's by an Australian Agricultural Company. Early records describe the area as a potential food bowl. The Gloucester Region continues today to produce a wide variety of food and other products. Climate change models predict that the Gloucester region will continue to enjoy a favourable production climate.

The Gloucester Farmers Markets started when Gloucester residents, local producers and small growers identified the need to provide a local outlet for fresh, nutritious food. The increasing impact of climate change, increasing fuel costs and growing demand for quality food brought together community members, small growers and farmers with the help of Gloucester Shire Council and independent local businesses.

At the Gloucester Farmers Market, we believe that everyone has the right to enjoy fresh, nutritious and where possible, organic produce grown and supplied from within our local region. The market also seeks to enable and encourage small and emerging growers by providing an easy and affordable link to potential customers – the start of many a food production business. We encourage sustainable growing techniques and foster whole community involvement.
